



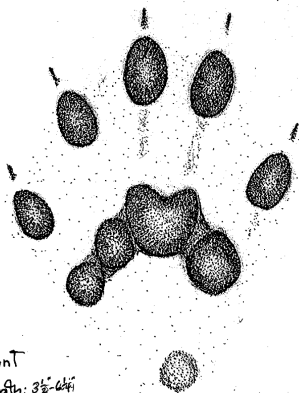
## Wolverine (*Gulo gulo*) Observation Quick Guide

### Sighting

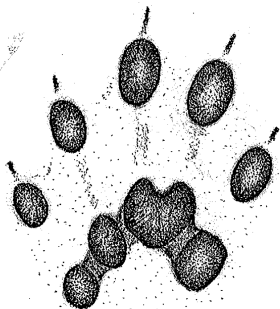
- 1) Record time, date, and location. If unable to photograph the animal, try to photograph tracks. Celebrate!

### Tracks

- 2) Search in a variety of locations for the clearest tracks. Look for where the animal has entered more sheltered areas away from direct sunlight, wind, further snowfall, or whatever may have obscured the tracks.
- 3) Photograph tracks, trail patterns, and other signs as outlined on the back of this guide. In your photo include a ruler, ski pole with tick marks, or any type of reference that indicates size down to the centimeter or inch.
- 4) Submit your observation through our easy online form accessible through our website.

## Wolverine *Gulo gulo*

### Size

Length: 86 - 107cm

Weight: 6.6 - 16.2kg

### Appearance

Short and stocky with rounded ears and long bushy tail. Dark brown fur, often with blond face mask, and lateral stripe.

### Similar species

American marten, fisher, river otter, badger, hoary marmot.
